Sailboat Types:

- **Daysailers** are known for their simplicity and ease of use. With a single mast, a jib, a centerboard, a tiller, and a monohull design without a keel, they feature a straightforward rigging system that makes these small boats relatively easy to operate and maneuver. Daysailers typically have an open cockpit layout, allowing a small crew or an individual to sit comfortably and sail the boat, e.g., Capri 14, Y-Flyer, Sunfish*
- **Cruiser** is a sailboat featuring accommodations below deck, designed for extended trips. It has a single mast, jib, centerboard, tiller, monohull, and keel, and an open cockpit layout allowing a small crew to sit comfortably and sail the boat.; e.g. Precision-18
- **Catamaran** has two hulls, a single mast, a jib, no centerboard, two tillers, and no keel. The cockpit layout resembles a trampoline, allowing a small crew to sit and sail the boat comfortably.

*Sunfish has one mast and no jib
