Saturday was rainy but the regatta got off three races late. As it turned out, that was it. Sailing there along with HSA's Ken Wright and Yours Truly were HSA friends Tom Katterheinrich, Gail Turluck, and Bill Sanderson

Katterheinrich, from Lake St. Mary's, is a regular on the Sunfish tour and attended our own AuGusto! along with Gail Turluck, another regular, who hails from Gull Lake in Michigan.

Katterheinrich has been attending the Devil's Lake event since 1964 when he was a junior crewing for his dad in a Lightning. He has only missed three of those regattas in that span. The regatta always features two starts: Lightning and Sunfish. Turluck has attended 30 years in a row without missing.

Sanderson is from Akron but got his sailing chops at Hueston Woods in Sunfish back in the 70's and 80's before moving to the Akron area and sailing in Interlakes. The top five received trophies. First three places qualified for the Sunfish Worlds next year.

Dan Norton of Devil's Lake took all three races to finish on top, followed by Pymatuning's Ron McHenry who had a 2 3 2. Yours Truly finished fourth, one point out of third place. Katterheinrich was three points behind in fifth and Turluck was 7th.

Ken Wright finished in 10th place and Sanderson was eighth. The club at Devil's lake, a late 19th century hotel converted to a club in 1948, is an great facility and well worth the trip.
